Where is Biochar Work Happening?

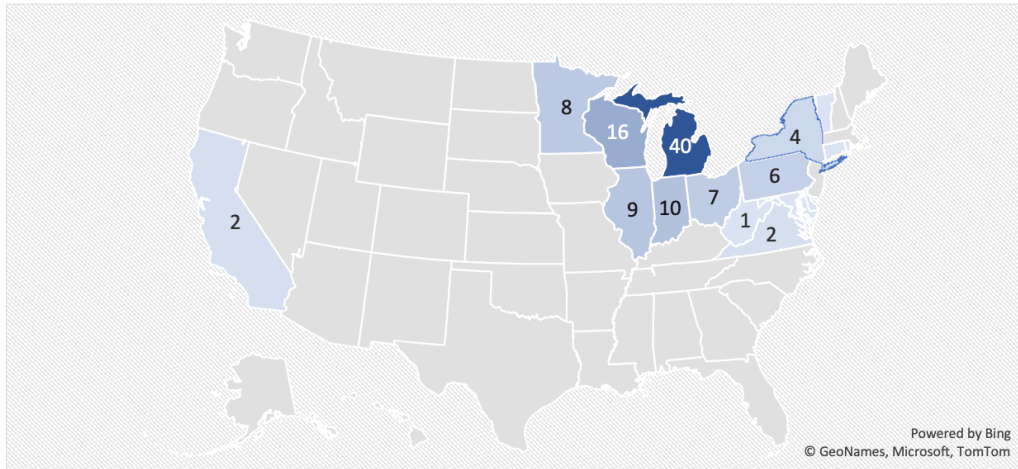


Figure 1: This map shows the states where people operating out of the Great Lakes region reported doing biochar work. The numbers indicate how many people reported doing biochar work in that state in our GLBN Networking Survey between December 2022 and July 2023. This map does not include work reported in Finland, Columbia, Ontario, and Nigeria.

In What Capacity Are Stakeholders Involved with Biochar?

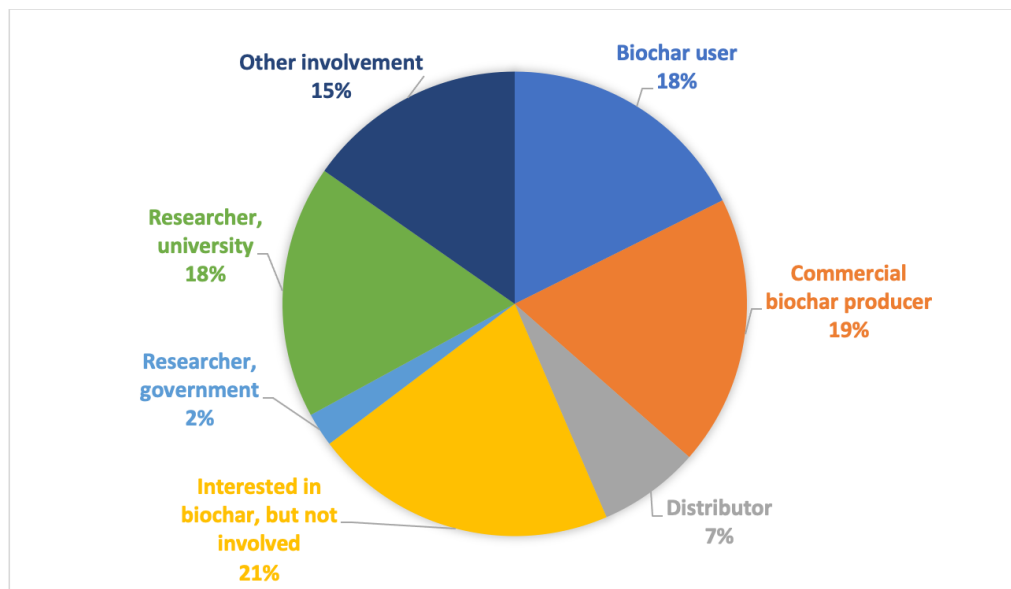


Figure 2: This pie chart shows in what capacity people working in the Great Lakes region reported being involved in biochar in our GLBN Networking Survey between December 2022 and July 2023.
